Caring Canines

Once again, Caring Canines started out the year with a full plate. Members have visited many schools and presented various talks with our puppies. We hope to enlighten the community as to the need for Seeing Eye guides and 4-H. The Club also wishes to welcome Errol, Paige, Dorothy, Babs, Ocho, Kris, Yvette, Ivy and Mango, as our new additions to the club.

January - We presented at St. Paul's Catholic School. The Club has presented annually at this school for over 5 years with the same teacher. We believe that the teacher knows more than we do about the Seeing Eye! We also presented at Beck School in Cherry Hill and at the 4-H Jamboree/Skill-a-Thon. It was great to let members from other clubs and the public handle a Seeing Eye puppy to get "hands-on experience".

February - We presented at Temple Beth Shalom Preschool in Cherry Hill and attended the annual "Kids with a Smile" at Burling-

ton County Community College (BCC). This is a wonderful program for families who do not have dental insurance. We are there to give the kids a diversion before and after their dental work, which could involve x-rays, etc. The kids all love the puppies and so do the adults who work there or volunteer their time. Any child 12 and under can receive free dental work. Throughout the year, you can have teeth cleanings done for a fee of \$5.00. The program is run through BCC's dental program. Members also attended and participated in the county's first Dog Bowl. To end the month, the Club went bowling. This event is crucial for the puppies,; it's great for socialization, and it gets the puppies familiar with noises and different floor textures. Believe it or not, blind/seeing impaired people LOVE to bowl.

March - Members of Caring Canines attended the Burlington County Freeholders meeting. We, as a club, represented that this County benefits from organizations like the 4-H and would suffer im-

mensely without the 4-H program. Member **Corinne Cooper** wrote a letter and spoke at the meeting to the Freeholders. Her project, Babs, a German shepherd puppy, was not allowed in the Board room and stayed in the hallway. We also presented at Pemberton Township's Rotary, Pemberton High School's Interact Group and Levitt Middle School in Willingboro.

April - So far this month, we presented at Central Early Development Center in Deptford, and Jagard School in Marlton. Members also attended Goal Ball, which is a sport that blind/seeing impaired people play. The gym must be completely silent during this match. We are also preparing our puppies for Rutgers Day (formerly AG Field Day). This is the State Dog Show where we enter our puppies in competition and for trainers of the Seeing Eye to see what puppies they will be receiving in the months to come.
