WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Burlington (the "Board") places the public trust above all else and remains steadfast in its commitment to the highest ethical standards in the conduct of its business on behalf of the taxpayers of Burlington County; and

WHEREAS, authorization to prohibit the feeding of unconfined wildlife in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by County of Burlington, so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of this resolution, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- a. Feed – to give, place, expose, deposit, distribute or scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting or enticing wildlife. Feeding does not include baiting in the legal taking of fish and/or game.
- b. Person – any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- c. Wildlife – all animals that are neither human nor domesticated; and

WHEREAS, no person shall feed, in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by County of Burlington, any wildlife, excluding confined wildlife (for example, wildlife confined in zoos, parks or rehabilitation centers, or unconfined wildlife at environmental education centers, or feral cats as part of an approved Trap-Neuter-Release program); and

WHEREAS, this resolution shall be enforced by the Local Police Department and/or other Municipal Officials in County of Burlington; and

WHEREAS, any person found to be in violation of this resolution shall be ordered to cease the feeding immediately; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Burlington (the "Board") places the public trust above all else and remains steadfast in its commitment to the highest ethical standards in the conduct of its business on behalf of the taxpayers of Burlington County; and

WHEREAS, as a requirement of Burlington County's New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Stormwater General Permit, Burlington County (the "County") is required to create and issue a policy for all employees regarding the disposal of waste at County owned properties. This Disposal of Waste Policy (the "Policy") shall include but not be limited to general grounds, office complexes, parks and other County owned Land or Facilities; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of this resolution, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory:

- A. Pet Waste-All pet waste that is generated on Public Grounds shall be picked up immediately and disposed of properly. Pet Waste shall be picked up and disposed of in a waste can.
- B. Litter-Which is defined in N.J.S.A. 13:1E-215 as "any used or unconsumed substance or waste material which has been discarded, whether made of aluminum, glass, plastic, rubber, paper, or other natural or synthetic material." Examples of "Litter" are, fast food wrappers, used/unused cigarettes/cigar, matches, rubbish, soda cans, and bottles and other trash could eventually end up in our water bodies if not disposed of properly. This could have a negative impact on marine and other wildlife. All litter is to be disposed of properly and into a waste can. State Litter Statute (N.J.S.A. 13:1E-99.3).
- C. Liquid Waste-Shall include materials like automotive fluids, used motor oil, paints and solvents. This waste and other liquid waste shall be disposed of at the County Hazardous Waste Collection Site/Landfill. If not disposed of properly these materials can pollute the land, migrate to our water bodies and have a negative impact on marine and other wildlife; and

WHEREAS, no County employee shall feed, in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by County of Burlington, any wildlife, excluding confined wildlife (for example, wildlife confined in zoos, parks or rehabilitation centers, or unconfined wildlife at environmental education centers, or feral cats as part of an approved Trap-Neuter-Release program); and

WHEREAS, if any employee observes another employee or user of County owned Lands or Facilities violating this Policy, they shall report the incident to the Burlington County Division of Stormwater at (609) 726-7300; and

WHEREAS, any person found to be in violation of this resolution shall be ordered to cease the feeding immediately; and

WHEREAS, all employees are required to follow the above rules and regulations regarding properly disposing of waste on County owned Lands and Facilities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Burlington County Policy regarding Disposal of Waste is hereby authorized and approved; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption approved until such time the Board finds it necessary to amend, revoke, or modify the Policy as required by law or otherwise.

WHEREAS, the Board hereby prohibits "Illicit Connection", so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for failure to comply; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of this Resolution "Illicit Connection" is defined as any physical or non-physical connection that discharges domestic sewage, non-contact water, process wastewater, or other industrial waste (other than stormwater) to the County's separate storm sewer system operated by the County of Burlington, unless that discharge is authorized under a NJPDES permit other than the Highway Agency Stormwater General Permit (NJPDES Permit Number NJG0150223). Non-physical connections may include, but are not limited to, leaks, flows, or overflows into the County separate storm sewer system; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution shall be enforced by the Burlington County Health Department, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), and the County of Burlington; and

WHEREAS, any person or entity found to be in violation of this Resolution shall be ordered to cease the Illicit Connection immediately; and

WHEREAS, any person(s) or entity who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this Resolution shall be subject to a fine. The municipality where the violation occurred will have jurisdiction to determine fine amounts; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Burlington each sentence, clause and phrase of this resolution is declared to be an independent section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase, and the finding or of any such portion of this Resolution to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause, or reason, shall not affect any other portion of this Resolution; and, be it
