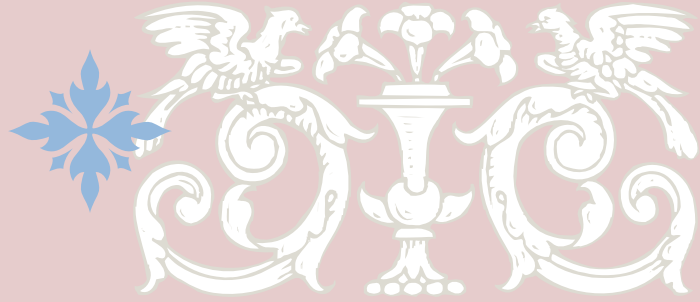


DIRECTORY OF SERVICES

WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD



The Burlington County Workforce Investment Board, commonly known as the WIB, was established in May 1995. There are 17 Workforce Investment Boards in New Jersey.

The primary responsibility of the WIB is to serve as an alliance of the public and private sector for the purpose of coordinating planning, policy guidance and oversight of employment and training activities in Burlington County. In partnership with the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the overall goal is to develop and sustain a unified, labor market-driven system that can deliver needed services to job seekers and employers in an effective and cost efficient manner.

The WIB is led by representatives from the private sector, and includes membership from education, organized labor, employment and training, human services, community and faith-based organizations.

The WIB does not actually operate programs, but works to influence the management of workforce development activities by analyzing local needs and coordinating Federal, State and local resources. Much of the Board's work is done through its committees and sub-committees, which include the Literacy Committee, the Job Center Committee (formerly known as One-Stop), the Business Solutions Team, the Work First Operations Committee, the Youth Council and the Economic Development Committee.

The Burlington County Workforce Investment Board is committed to building and maintaining a workforce of the highest quality. Our services are designed to not only benefit employers and job seekers, but to enhance the social economic well being of all citizens who live and work in Burlington County.

UNIVERSALITY

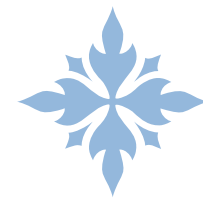

The Job Center system's partnership with Burlington County Institute of Technology, Burlington County College and other local organizations help to provide integrated access to high-quality services.

WORKPLACE LEARNING LINK

The Workplace Learning Link, with the long range goal of successful employment, was designed to identify and develop a customer's basic education skills/aptitudes. Through individualized computer-based programs in reading, math, language, career and life skills, the customer becomes more competitive in the job market or capable of entering an education program.

The Learning Link requires a fourth-grade reading and math level and the customer's commitment to attend five (5) days per week. Through the customer's level of dedication, an atmosphere of accomplishment is established while improving the skills necessary for obtaining successful employment. Daily contact with the Workplace Learning Link instructor and counselor reinforces the customer's self-esteem and empowers the customer with the necessary confidence to excel in the job market. The Link assists customers with increasing reading, math and basic workplace readiness skills necessary for entry level employment. With improved overall skills, the customer is prepared to gain a level of independence and self-sufficiency.
