

Dec. 1, 2016 - Act Today to Solve the Ewaste (TV & Computer) Recycling Crisis in New Jersey

The recycling of Ewaste (TVs and computers) has reached a *crisis point* in New Jersey.

The current NJ Electronic Waste Management Law should have provided free and convenient ewaste recycling programs.

Loopholes in the law allowed manufacturers to avoid funding our ewaste programs.

Instead, many counties and towns (taxpayers) pay thousands of dollars to recycle their ewaste. The high costs have forced many local recycling programs to shut down!

Today, less than 30% of our residents have access to free ewaste recycling.

The result - a big jump in illegal dumping of TVs along roads, parks and streams.

The Burlington County Freeholders have supported a bill to fix the problem.

This bill only needs Governor Christie's signature to become law.

TV manufacturers want the Governor to veto the bill.

If that happens, it will be harder to recycle your TVs and computers.
