A peer-led teen enrichment and empowerment program, The Bridge Weekly Drop-in Sessions are held on Thursday nights from 7:30pm sharp to 9:00pm. Trained Bridge Youth Volunteer Leaders facilitate the sessions, presenting various topics including: Communication Skills, Leadership Skills, Goal Setting, Anti-Bullying/Violence Prevention, Peer Pressure, Drug & Alcohol Prevention, Teen Pregnancy Prevention, Conflict Resolution, Self-Esteem Building, Stress Management, Character Education, and Team Building Games. The Bridge also offers Drop-In Sessions that meet in Camden on Tuesday nights, from 7:30pm sharp to 9:00pm, at 1492 Haddon Ave. In order to lessen disruptions, we cannot allow anyone to enter the sessions after 7:30pm, so be sure to arrive on time!
